



## PUBLIC FACT SHEET No. 2 – Bushfire Preparation

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### FACT

While there are elements of bushfire that you cannot control, like the weather, there is a wide range of planning and preparation activities that you can undertake which will dramatically increase the chances of you, your family and your home surviving in the event of a bushfire., including the maintenance of adequate levels of insurance.

#### Always have an up to date Bushfire Survival Plan

- Review and rehearse your plan regularly
- Involve the whole family so everyone knows what to do
- Have a contingency plan and know the location of your local **Neighbourhood Safer Place**
- Always know the current Fire Danger Rating in your area

#### Always maintain a defendable space around your home by

- Mowing your grass regularly
- Removing excess ground fuels and other combustible material
- Cleaning leaves from gutters, roofs and downpipes regularly
- Trimming low lying branches 2 metres from the ground surrounding your home

#### You should also

- Enclose open areas under your decks and floors
- Install fine steel wire mesh screens on all windows, doors, vents and weepholes
- Relocate flammable items away from your home including woodpiles, paper, boxes, crates, hanging baskets and garden furniture
- Seal all gaps in external roof and wall cladding

#### Ensure you have prepared and have ready access to your

- Personal protective clothing
- Bushfire Survival Kit
- Relocation Kit

On days of **Catastrophic** fire danger rating leaving is the **ONLY** option to ensure you and your families' survival and on days of **Extreme** fire danger rating leaving is the safest option.

Failure to take action can result in death or injury to you or your family members.
